 - ❖ Leading small book groups with books featuring girls as heroines;
 - ❖ Helping girls engage with books/literature through theater studies;
 - ❖ Helping high school girls create 1st generation pathways to college;
 - ❖ Creating educational connections between locally sourced farm foods, healthy eating, and digital literacy learning;
 - ❖ Helping adolescent girls engage meaningfully with photography;
 - ❖ Creating fun movement/dance and arts & crafts activities;
 - ❖ Planning a large Exhibition event to showcase girls' learning;
 - ❖ Helping support PAGE's growth as a non-profit organization.
